

Asking For and Giving Directions

We use fixed phrases to ask for directions to somewhere. Here are some examples:

Where is (the) ?	Can you give me directions to (the) ?
How do you get to (the) ?	Where can I find the nearest ?
How do I get to (the) ?	Is there a near/around here?
Can you tell me how to get to (the) ?	<i>What's the best/quickest/easiest way to get to (the) ?</i>

Some sample questions and responses

Question	Response
Excuse me. Is there a chemist around here?	Yes, there is one <i>just across the street</i> .
<i>Can you give me directions to the station?</i>	Of course, <i>follow this road</i> until you come to the main road. <i>Turn left</i> and <i>continue for</i> about 200 metres. <i>You will see</i> the station <i>on the right</i> .
<i>Can you tell me how to get to the Focus Building?</i>	Sorry, <i>I am not from around here</i> .
Where's the nearest taxi rank?	It's <i>on the corner of</i> High St and Rose Lane. <i>Next to</i> the library.
How do you get to the post office?	<i>Go straight along</i> this road for about 400 metres. <i>Turn left when you get to</i> Lemon Lane. <i>Keep</i> <i>going until you reach</i> the church. The post office is <i>opposite</i> the church.
Is there a bank near here?	Yes, there is one in Bank Street. Bank Street is <i>the second road on your left</i> .
Excuse me. Could you tell me where I can find the nearest 24- hour shop?	Yes, there is one next to the station. <i>Go back the way you came. Turn left</i> after you go under the railway bridge and there is one <i>on your right</i> .



Useful words and phrases

Asking	Directions
Asking How do I get to ? Where is ? What's the best way to ? Is there a near here?	Go straight on (until you come to) Turn back / Go back. Turn left/right (into ' Street') Go along Cross Take the first/second road on the left/right.
Where can I ?	Go back the way you came. Go under/over the bridge. Take the second exit at the roundabout.
Position	Landmarks
It's on the left/right straight on opposite near next to between at the end (of) on/at the corner (of) behind in front of (just) around the corner	traffic lights crossroads, junction level crossing signpost roundabout T-junction dead end underpass flyover (railway) bridge dual carriageway
